I'm here tonight to stand and speak to the topic of fair business practice. Just as it is wrong for an elected official to take money or goods in exchange for consideration; it is wrong to treat similar businesses in the same zone with different rules.

Please do not construe anything I am saying here to mean that I at all believe that we should be restricting any business in town from operating as they are today; as long as they are abiding by the rules.
